Recital Tickets!

June- a link will be sent to the email that we have on file for you to purchase recital tickets. Please make sure you know which show your dancer is in before purchasing. You will be able to pick your seat at the time of purchase. Tickets prices: \$10, \$12, \$14. A ticket is required to enter the auditorium. Small children (babies) who will not take up a seat with their car seat or sitting in a seat will not need a ticket.

May 13th, 14th, 15th, 16th- all dancers will have their individual headshots taken during their regularly scheduled class time. Headshots will be displayed in our Program Book.

<u>Please come with hair & makeup done!</u> <u>Wear a solid color leotard.</u>

For the safety of the dancers, NO photography is permitted. Anyone seen recording video or taking photos will be asked to leave. For your convenience, the recital dances will be forwarded to your email via digital download a few weeks after recital. This was part of your recital fee.



Make Up is necessary to avoid a washedout look under the bright stage lights. Please use the following directions as a guide.

1. Use an All-Day Lipstick (red).

2. Use Base & Powder to match skin tone.

3. Eye Shadow (Neutral shades) - Use base color over lid, then darker in the crease.

4. Blush- pink shades

5. Mascara (black) – parental discretion See page 5 for step-by-step directions. For safety purposes, ABSOLUTELY NO JEWELRY PERMITTED (unless a part of the costume).

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Studio Rehearsal prior to Recital is JUNE 10^{th} - 13^{th}

MANDATORY FOR ALL DANCERS.

This rehearsal is closed to the public. ONE (1) parent per dancer will be allowed in to take notes the last 5-10 minutes of your dancer's class. Dancers should wear their costumes, practice tights, recital hair and makeup. This will take place during your dancer's normal weekly class time.

Please review the dismissal form included in this packet

For your child's safety, the following dismissal policy will be enforced. **NO EXCEPTIONS! RECITAL:** Students will be dismissed from their dressing room by a backstage helper. Please, only one parent for pick up per dancer to avoid crowds in the dressing area. *No dancers should be in the auditorium before, during or after their performance.



Recital is short so please no meals or snacks in dance bags. There will not be anytime for them to snack. Feed your dancer beforehand to ensure they are good during recital. If you pack a small water bottle place dancers name on it.

We are not responsible for any lost items. Dancers' names should be inside shoes, bags, and costumes/accessories.



Dress Rehearsal and Recital – Makeup Application Instructions



"Why does she need to wear so much makeup for the recital? She's too young." "How do I do dance recital makeup? I don't even wear makeup myself."

a) **Those super cute shiny costumes look stunning on stage!** And they will completely overshadow your dancer's beautiful smile and facial expression if we don't apply enough makeup.

b) The stage lights are very intense and make a dancer's face look washed out. Properly applied makeup will enhance your dancer's features under bright, colorful stage lights.

c) The dancers are elevated on a stage and are very far away from the audience. This makes the facial features disappear and your dancer will look less lively and joyful on stage.

Dress Rehearsal and Recital – Hair Instructions

Each dancer will receive a handout that will tell you the hairstyle needed for their Recital.

BIPOC Dancers: we ask that the hair is securely fastened AWAY from face and pulled into a bun/pony to the best of your ability. We <u>do not</u> require braids to be removed for recital.

1) If you've never done recital hair before our **BIGGEST SECRET** to share is to make sure your dancer's **hair is DAMP** before you start to work with it. Either after a bath/shower, or you can dip a brush/comb into a cup of water to dampen the hair with or use a spray bottle. This makes the hair more pliable and easier to manage.

2) Gel, gel, gel, gel, gel. Did we mention gel? Gel is your best friend, use it or you'll lose it. Make sure you apply the gel to DAMP hair.

3) Please, ensure all hair tie elastics **MATCH** the dancer's hair.

- 4) Buns should be secured with hairpins & a hairnet that **matches** the dancer's hair.
- 5) All hairpieces should be secured with hairpins that match the dancer's hair.

Dress Rehearsal and Recital – Hair Instructions (for high/low bun)



Step 1

Using the hairbrush or comb, brush the hair back into a ponytail (please refer to class list for placement, high or low). Apply hairspray or gel to tame wisps and strands of hair that are not long enough to reach the ponytail. Then secure the ponytail with an elastic hair tie. Depending on the dance you could make the bun down on the neck, middle of the head or higher. So, make sure you know which one is required for your dancer.

For weekly class, you can do the height of the bun wherever you are comfortable.



Step 2

Twist (or braid) the ponytail and put in pins. Start twisting the hair and put it around the center making a tight circle. Then secure the twist with the bobby pins or hairpins by putting them as many as you need. To do this, open the pin and then make sure the pin grabs part of the hair from the twist and goes straight in the head. If the dancer feels a constant pain when the pin is applied remove it and put it again until there is no pain. If you have a lot of hair, you can divide the ponytail in two parts and twist them apart. Put one twist around first with pins and then the other twist. Depending on your hair if it is thin or thicker you can use extra bobby pins to grab bumps and thin hairs and the hairpins for thicker parts.



Step 3

Put the hair net on. Wrap the hair net around the bun to catch loose hairs. With a few twists the net should be tight on the bun, and you can put some pins to secure it. You can also insert more pins around the bun to re-shape or secure loose parts of the bun.



Step 4

Use hair spray or gel to secure hair around the face or any loose strands. This step is fundamental for shows, but for class, do so as needed.

Dress Rehearsal and Recital – Hair Instruction Continued

Slicking back the hair

It's important for the hair, whether it be a bun or ponytail, to be pulled back securely, and free of fly-a-ways. To get this slicked-back look, a little bit of water and hair gel will typically do the trick. Before pulling the hair back in to the ponytail, spray the roots with some water to dampen it, then work in some gel. As you brush through and secure the ponytail, this will help set it in a sleek and smooth look.

If you have some fly-a-way hairs, spray them with hairspray and use a toothbrush to brush them down (this is a great tip one of our dancers shared with us and it works very well). For the stubborn fly-a-way hairs at the back of the neck, use bobby pins and hairspray to secure them in place.

Finally, top off your look with a finishing coat of hairspray. Don't worry if the hair feels hard or sticky. No one will touch a dancer's hair on stage, but it does need to be held securely in place with good elastics, bobby pins and hair products. The tighter, slicker, and more solid the hairstyle feels, the better!

The Shake Test

To ensure a hair style is secure for a dance performance, ask your dancer to shake her head around for about 15 seconds – moving up, down, forwards, backwards, and side to side. If it feels loose to them, tighten it with additional elastics and hairpins. No one wants a dancer's bun to fall apart on stage in the middle of a dance!

Final Thoughts

Use elastics, bobby pins, and hairnets that match your dancer's hair color. Fluorescent hair elastics and bobby pins can distract the audience from the dance. In a group dance, dancers should look uniform. This includes their hair.

Remember to use a hairnet to secure your bun. Hairnets really can save a bun by helping to hold the bun in place and flatten it out.

If your dancer has a hairpiece for a dance, don't forget to put that in her hair too. The general rule for hairpieces is if one person doesn't have theirs for a picture or performance, no one in the group wears one!

Practice your hairstyles. Nothing can be more frustrating than hair trouble on picture day or performance day. Practicing buns and ponytails a few days before will help make performance day hair-prep run smoothly and stressfree.

Do you need help with hair and makeup?

The Rosette Booster club will be doing a fundraiser again this year to help parents with hair and makeup. Watch for the sign-up sheets. They will only take a small number of dancers. All funds will go into the Rosette Booster account to help our competition team with expenses. Watch for sign-up sheets.

ABSOLUTELY NO PHOTOS OR VIDEOS DURING THE RECITALS

Dance pictures are one of our favorite parts of recital season!

These pictures last a lifetime and show you just how much your dancers have grown over the years!

Professional costume pictures will be taken at the stage dress rehearsal at Franklin Community High School. Teachers/assistants will take the group to have their individual pictures taken in costume.

Dancers should wear nice tights, proper dance shoes, costume, correct hair and stage makeup for the dress rehearsal and pictures.

What you need to know:

- 1. Pictures will be taken at our stage Dress Rehearsal at Franklin Community High School.
- 2. Dancers should come to dress rehearsal with HAIR AND MAKEUP DONE. If you have any concerns regarding doing your dancers hair or makeup, please contact the office for assistance. *The Rosette Booster club will be doing a fundraiser to help those in need with hair and makeup. Sign up sheets will be posted. Limited spaces available.*
- 3. Dancers should not go home in their costume, this will run the risk of the costume ripping, getting dirty, or losing pieces.
- 4. Parents <u>will not be allowed</u> in the photo area to avoid distraction.
- 5. **"Do parents need to stay during stage dress rehearsal?"** After checking in your dancer backstage, we ask that all parents go to the auditorium to watch the dress rehearsal. Announcement will be made when your dancer is finished.

WHAT SHOULD I BRING TO DRESS REHEARSAL AND RECITAL?

- Dress Rehearsal enter door 50. Recital- Dancers enter door 50. Audience enter door 55, one hour before show.
- Arrive with hair and makeup done and tights on
- Easy outfit and slip on shoes to wear to and after dress rehearsal and recital.
- All costumes and accessories with names hidden inside costume.
- All needed dance shoes with name inside of shoes
- Extra tights- write dancers name on the spare package.
- Check that you have all hair accessories and props (if applicable)
- Makeup for touch ups
- Extra bobby pins/hairspray/hairnets/hair ties (that match hair color)
- Water bottle with name on it
- Hairbrush/comb
- Deodorant (if applicable)
- Double check that all nail polish has been removed!
- No underwear. Tights are underwear.
- No colored bras or sports bras. Clear straps only.
- We have nude leotards and nude bras with clear straps in stock.
